

Mead Public Library has AccuQuilt Go Cutting Machine Available for Community Use

Perfect quilts start with perfect cuts. One method of making perfect cuts is through the use of a fabric cutting machine. The Accuquilt “Go Big!” is an electric fabric cutting machine which is available for community use.

Mead’s Accuquilt is available for anyone to use. Library card holders must view a demonstration by a library staff member or volunteer to learn to use the machine and to “get badged” for future independent use. Demonstrations are offered on Wednesdays from 4 pm to 7 pm and on the second Saturdays of the month from 1 pm to 4 pm. No appointment is needed, interested persons just need to stop by with their library card during one of these open sessions. Once badged, individuals can use the “Go Big!” when the library is open and there isn’t another program scheduled in the 2nd floor Imaginarium where the Accuquilt Cutter is kept.
